Named after....

- Mission was named after Charles Borromeo. He was a 16th century Cardinal and the archbishop of Milan, Italy.



Designs of the mission

- The roof and walls were made of *yellow* sand stone. The sandstone is made with abalone shells.
- It's formed in a quadrangle with a fountain in the middle surrounded by **beautiful** gardens and olive trees.
- The bell tower holds 8 bells with a staircase.
- There were hardly any acres.

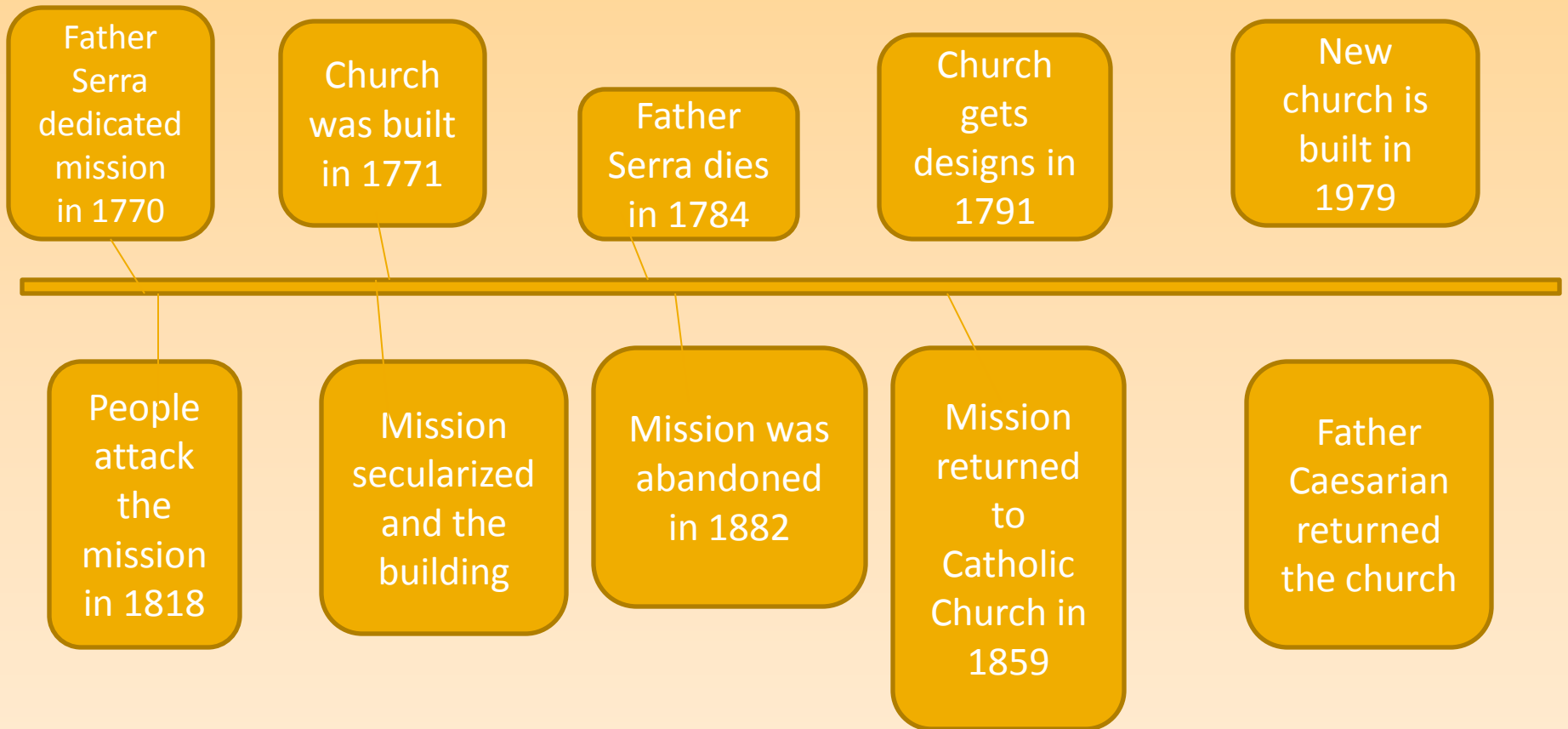
Mission Music
